### WHAT ARE SCHOOL-BASED MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES?

All services are voluntary; a parent or legal guardian must complete appropriate consents and releases prior to a therapist meeting with the child or adolescent.

- Length and type of treatment are determined by need and may include individual, family and/or parent therapy
- Regardless of whether school is in session, therapy services can be accessed at any time during the year
- Therapy takes place in a private, confidential office provided by the school
- School-based therapists can refer clients to the Child Guidance Center office for group therapy, psychiatric evaluation, medication management and psychological evaluations

# WHY MENTAL HEALTH IN SCHOOLS?

Research shows that a child's social, emotional, behavioral and mental health is an important part of school success. Treating children in schools eliminates lost learning due to transportation to appointments. In addition, on-site therapists can advocate and support children and their families through collaboration with school staff.
